In Florida, David Feldman, a retired consulting engineer, has been making life difficult for the mass-burn industry by pointing out the shortcomings of their technology and track record. 
Re: October 9th meeting of the Greater Dade City Chamber of Commerce

Dear Mr. Feldman:

It has come to our attention that you will be speaking at the above-referenced meeting on the topic of waste incineration. Calling to mind our letters to you of March 28 and May 2, 1989 in which we put you on notice that statements you had been publishing about our company were defamatory, we are justifiably concerned about what you may say at the October 9th meeting. Accordingly, we are advising you that we intend to record the meeting in its entirety.

You may recall that we underscored in our earlier letter our support for an individual's free speech rights. At the same time, we admonished you regarding your obligation to investigate the facts and to speak the truth and your repeated and persistent failure to have done so. We warned you then, and remind you now, that if you make any further false statements or misrepresentations, we will pursue all available legal remedies to redress our injuries caused by you.

Based on our conversations with David Feldman it would appear that any "mistakes" that he made were not of any significant kind. Which is more than can be said of those who have promoted mass-burn incineration over the last five years. It is unfortunate that they have not lived up to David Sokol's admonishment to "investigate the facts and to speak the truth". How many communities in the USA have been told that: "The only thing that will come out of the stacks will be carbon dioxide and water"; "all the dioxins will be destroyed because we are burning at high temperatures"; "the health risks will be no greater than smoking two cigarettes"; "the ash is non-toxic"; "while dioxin is toxic for animals it is not toxic for humans"; and Mr. Sokol's own claim in a TV debate in Massachusetts that **Ogden Martin** was recycling more than any other company in the USA!
